

**Betty M. Chemers** is a senior project officer at the National Academy of Sciences which she joined in May 2005 after spending 30 years in the public and not-for-profit sectors working on criminal justice and juvenile justice issues. She is currently the director of the NAS study on 'Technical and Privacy Dimensions of Information for Terrorism Prevention and Other National Goals' funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF) and the Department of Homeland Security. Prior to this she held numerous positions at the U.S. Department of Justice including: director of the evaluation division of the National Institute of Justice (2002-2005), and deputy administrator for discretionary programs at the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (1995-2001) where she oversaw its \$100 million budget of research, demonstration, and training and technical assistance activities.
