

Nancy J. Kirkendall joined the staff of the Committee on National Statistics as a senior program officer in May 2009. Currently, she is study director for the Panel on Using the ACS to Estimate the Percent of Children Eligible for the School Meals Program. She is also assisting with the Panel on Redesigning the Commercial and Residential Energy Consumption Surveys of the Energy Information Administration. Dr. Kirkendall served as director of the Statistics and Methods Group, Energy Information Administration (EIA), and as a member of EIA's senior staff from 2002-2008. She has held a variety of other positions in EIA. From 1996 to 1999 Dr. Kirkendall served as senior mathematical statistician in the Statistical Policy Branch, Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs, Office of Management and Budget. There she also served as the desk officer for the US Bureau of Census, the chair of the Federal Committee on Statistical Methodology, and led a variety of interagency activities. She taught part-time at the George Washington University in the statistics department from 1978-1996 and in the engineering management and systems engineering department from 1996-2002. She is a past vice president of the American Statistical Association and a past president of the Washington Statistical Society. She received the Roger Herriot Award for Innovation in Federal Statistics in 2007, the American Statistical Association's Founder's Award in 2001, and was awarded the status of fellow of the American Statistical Association in 1993. Dr. Kirkendall is a member of the American Statistical Association's Committee on Energy Statistics and the Accreditation Implementation Committee. She holds a Ph.D. in mathematical statistics from George Washington University, and bachelors and masters degrees in mathematics from Ohio State University.
