

Michael L. Cohen is a senior program officer for the Committee on National Statistics. He is currently serving as study director, or co-study director, for the Workshop on Industrial Methods for the Effective test and Development of Defense Systems and the Workshop on Handling Missing Data in Clinical Trials. Previously, he has primarily directed studies involving census and survey methodology and the testing and evaluation of defense systems in development. He was a mathematical statistician at the Energy Information Administration, an assistant professor at the School of Public Affairs at the University of Maryland, and a visiting lecturer in statistics at Princeton University.
